MISSION GRANT PROGRAM

It is the purpose of this grant program to:

- 1. Encourage greater diversity among organizations involved in handbell ringing,
- 2. Enable organizations which require financial assistance to initiate, expand, or revitalize handbell/handchime programs.

Eligibility Requirements

Individuals interested in developing a handbell/handchime program for a community group, an educational institution, a group with special needs, a nursing home, a religious organization, or a retirement community are encouraged to apply.

Grants will be awarded as follows:

- 1. Non-Matching grants up to but not to exceed \$500 per grant will be awarded for the purchase or repair of handbells/handchimes.
- 2. Matching grants of \$501 but not to exceed \$1000 per grant will be awarded for the purchase or repair of handbells/handchimes.

The deadline for a grant application is January 1, 2003.

- 2. Explain in detail your organization's financial need for this funding.
- 3. Describe the project for which you seek funding.
- 4. Prepare a budget and indicate the total amount you are requesting. In the budget, show any matching or additional financial or volunteer support your organization will be given toward this project.
- 5. If your organization is awarded this grant, what are your plans for the future funding of this project?
- 6. Please enclose a letter from the chief administrator verifying the financial need of your organization and the support of this project. Also express the willingness of your organization to submit a written evaluation of your project to the Area II Board one year from the date you receive the grant.
- 7. You may submit additional documents that support your project such as references that give more information about your work and purpose.

Special Notes

- 1. In addition to written evaluation and possible visitation by members of the Area II Board, Mission Grant awardees will be required to have a representative attend and participate in the classes and workshops at the Area II Festival Conference in the year of the award or another Area II event within 18 months from the date of the award.
- 2. Awardees will be required to have an official representative accept the award in public at the Area II Festival Conference Concert in the year of the award.



On Saturday, April 6, more than 160 ringers representing 18 choirs, gathered at the Church of the Covenant in Washington, PA for the Second Annual W PA Handbell Festival. This one-day festival began at 9:30 AM and concluded with a 6 PM concert that was well attended by families and local handbell enthusiasts.

Ken Kelley, Area II Chair, was the festival conductor. Ron Hann, Minister of Music at Church of the Covenant, was host. Margaret Zabo, Area II Financial Advisor, was the registrar.

In addition to working together toward performing the six festival selections, the group had the opportunity to choose from a number of classes, all of which were offered twice. This festival was begun last year for choirs ringing at levels 1 and 2. The music selections were known almost a year ahead. AREA II READ & RING SEMINAR 2002!

The Read and Ring Seminar is being held August 8-10, 2002 at the Lancaster Host Resort and Conference Center in Lancaster, PA. The seminar is for teen and adult ringers and directors and will feature ringing sessions with outstanding clinicians, classes for both ringers and directors, the always-popular music reading sessions, solo and ensemble workshops, and private coaching sessions for solo ringers.


The two day event is perfect for those who wish to improve their ringing and directing skills as they ring under the baton of renown conductors. The seminar is designed for the ringer, director, solo ringer, ensemble, entire choir or several members of a choir. Registration forms for the seminar are on pages 11-12.

The Read and Ring Seminar features several outstanding clinicians: David Davidson, level 5-6 track; Valerie Stephenson, level 3-4 track; Kenneth Kelley, level 2-3 track; Marilyn Shenenberger, level 1-2 track; and Bobbi Schmid & Ron Bellamy of *Bell a deux*, solo and ensemble track. The clinicians will direct choirs based upon the level of difficulty of the music. These groups will meet several times during the seminar to practice the music and develop ringing skills. Participants will pre-register for the level that best fits their own ringing ability. Ringers will purchase and practice the music before coming to Lancaster. The list of music for the various tracks is on page 13. Participants must check their selection for a ringing level track on the registration form for the seminar.

Many exciting new things are taking place at the National office and at the National level of AGEHR. Sara Smith, the membership director, reports that after a period of declining membership, beginning in January 2002, our numbers show a small but steady increase. She continues to address the problem of retaining newer members, especially the manufacturer's gift memberships. On the grassroots level, we know that we must make personal contacts with new members but often lack the volunteers to do this job. Our District Coordinators do this but there are far too many vacancies in PA and NJ. If you have any ideas, contact Chris Braden, the Area II membership coordinator.

Look for news from Karen Leonard in coming issues of Overtones concerning details about significant changes in the way the National Board will operate. She hopes soon to be able to announce that a new Executive Director has been hired. In the interim, Bill Griffin, the AGEHR Music Editor has added the ED duties to his already busy schedule. We are grateful for his outstanding service.

Participation Fees have been a "hot button" issue ever since they were implemented in 1999. Each and every Area and National Board meeting, we have chewed on this topic. At the February meeting, a new approach was agreed upon after studying an extensive report by a sub-committee. Here is the outcome in a nutshell.

Beginning October 1, 2002, Participant Fees will be handled this way:

- 1. Areas will no longer pass along the fees to National for Area events, enabling Areas to keep 100% of the fees to support their own programs, rather than just 25% of this money.
- 2. AGEHR will retain the existing Endorsed Event portion of the Participation Fee and its fee structure and approval process, but with 100% (rather than 25%) of the fees remaining in the Area in which the Endorsed Event occurs.

The effect on the Areas will be a positive one financially, increasing their income. All insurance, ASCAP and publicity coverage for the Area and Endorsed events will continue as long as the current requirement of notifying the Dayton office in advance is met by the Areas.

If you need more information about this rather complicated subject, please contact me anytime. There will be opportunities to discuss this at our Read and Ring Seminar in August.

If you are still confused about Area Events and Endorsed Events, here is an explanation. Area events are those planned by the Area Board. This includes but is not limited to Festival Conferences and Seminars. Recently, board members have initiated a number of sub-area events such as the CHIME events for schools and the western PA festival.

Endorsed Events are those other events whose planners chose to take advantage of the excellent insurance and complete ASCAP coverage and opportunities for publicity that are provided by payment of the Participation fees to AGEHR.





There will be several different reading session held during the seminar. Vendors who sell handbell music will supply packets of music, both new selections as well as some oldies-but-goodies, for seminar participants to play during the various reading sessions. Sessions will include music for level 1-2, level 2-3, level 3-4, level 5-6, Area II Festival Conference music preview and Area II Young Ringers' Festival music preview. This music may be purchased from the vendors.

A track is available for 16 solo and ensemble ringers to work with Ron Bellamy and Bobbi Schmid. The ringers will be divided into four groups of four to work together on ensemble music. Individual coaching sessions will also be given by Ron and Bobbi. There are only four time slots available for the coaching sessions, and all of those are filled. Names are being placed on a waiting list.
