Since my last report to you, the National Bylaws revision was passed by the membership and at long last we had the 2002 election in April of 2003. The Bylaws revisions allowed for a complete change in the way AGEHR is not only governed but is operated. The National Board will become the policy-making entity it was always intended to be and the day-to-day operation of the Corporation is now in the capable hands of the Executive Director.

Since we will no longer have Area Representatives to the National Board, the Executive Director will establish direct links to the Areas through an Advisory Council. The first meeting of this Council will be during Directors' Seminar in Hartford this coming July. Chair Ken Kelley will represent Area II.

The National election was due last fall, with new officers to take over October 1, 2002. You may recall, you were asked to vote on extending the terms for those current officers until a vote could be taken on the forward to seeing you at Area 2 events in the future. Bylaws revision. The membership granted that authority. We had NO idea that the Bylaws revision process would be as protracted as it turned out to be. We first had to revise the Certificate of Incorporation and then finish work on the Bylaws. Like every Bylaws Committee in the past, we think we got it right this time!!! Gratefully, the membership agreed that we did it right and voted to accept the revisions. This

opened the way for the election of officers and a radically redesigned Board of Directors.

You all had the opportunity to vote for National officers and Directors, but perhaps many of you are not aware of the results of that election.



#### Area II Website and PDF files!

On several places on the Area II website and on the AGEHR website, there are pdf files. Well, what are pdf files and how do I read them?

PDF stands for Portable Document Format. It is portable in that with the appropriate software, pdf files can be read on almost any computer platform available. The software used to read pdf files is Adobe Acrobat Reader. Acrobat Reader is available to download for free onto your computer. Once Acrobat Reader is installed on your computer, you should not have any problems reading any of the pdf files that are on the website.

#### Instructions for Downloading Acrobat Reader

- Go to the following url: http://www.adobe.com/products/acrobat/readstep2.html
- 2. Select the language and platform for your computer. Language in most cases will be English. Platform is the type of operating system you have on your computer—Windows XP, Windows 98, Macintosh, etc.
- 3. Select "Download"
- 4. Select "Save" to save a file on your computer.
- 5. Run the file that was saved on your computer.
- 6. A setup screen will appear and ask a few questions such as where to store the software on the computer. Just click 'Next' each time you are asked.
- 7. You may need to reboot your computer prior to using Acrobat Reader
- 8. Delete the file that you saved earlier once setup is complete.



### Something New for Area II!

Something new is coming to a church or school near you in Area 2! Really! I can't tell you exactly what it is, because we are waiting for you to tell US exactly what you need.

The Area 2 Board has heard over and over the comments about the spring and fall workshops: "They are never held near me." "They are the wrong time of the year." "They are too expensive." "They just don't serve my needs." "My ringers won't go."

We are going to try to fix this. Really!



The clinician will work with you and address the needs of your choir. Here are just a few possible scenarios:


- · We just got our bells and need help getting started.
- · We want to go to a festival and need help with some of the music.
- The choir has a hard time knowing how to make bell changes properly.
- · We've been playing a few years, but we want to look and sound better.
- · We need help reading and playing complicated rhythms.

If you find your "issues" on this list, we can help you. If you have problems that are not on this list, we can still help you. Just ask. Perhaps you will want to include other churches or schools in "your workshop." The more the merrier! You provide the ringers, the bells, the problems, and we will try to provide the solution.

Directors, if you are saying to yourself, I am the one who needs the help, not the choir, read on! Here are some FAQs (Frequently Asked Questions) that will indicate that you might need a MENTOR instead of a clinician to do a workshop. A mentor will work one-on-one with you over a period of time to guide and help you solve your handbell problems.

- · My church bought bells, now what do I do?
- I am a ringer who has just been asked to direct the bell team. I don't know where to begin. Can you help?
- · How can I help the ringers who are non-music readers?
- I want to take my group to a festival, how do I get them prepared for this experience?
- · My ringers want to be able to play more advanced music, how can I make that possible?
- How can I best work with a mixed aged team that includes children to seniors?
- · Can you help me teach rhythms?
- · How should I organize my rehearsals?
- · I want to start an additional group. How do I do this?
- · I teach music in a school. How can I incorporate a ringing group into my program?
- · How can I convince my school supervisor that handbells/handchimes are a valid way to teach music?

#### **Nancy Hascall Concert Tour**


Nancy Hascall, solo ringer, conductor, and composer from Portland, Oregon, will tour Pennsylvania and Maryland in June. Nancy's concerts are listed here and in the Belletin Board on page 12. Nancy's concert program consists entirely of her own arrangements of classical, folk, sacred and popular tunes, both published and unpublished. One of the country's most versatile and artistic ringers, Nancy is the originator of "traveling four-in-hand," a method of using multiple-bell techniques to increase facility and musicality in solo ringing, which she teaches at handbell events throughout the U.S. and Canada. She has also authored several articles on ringing techniques for Overtones and is an awardwinning composer, with over 17 handbell compositions and arrangements in print.
