
I want to thank the Area II board. You have been terrific the past two years. It took all of us working together to accomplish everything that we did. My sincere thanks to each of you.

## **Trinity Alumni Ringers Reunion 2005**

In 1987, Director Dorothy Stearns brought her Trinity Ringers, a high school handbell group from Trinity United Methodist Church in Hackettstown, NJ, to Bucknell University for the Area II AGEHR Handbell festival, directed by Dr. William Payn. Attending Area II festivals has been a tradition for the Trinity Ringers since 1978 and the event at Bucknell in 1987 has remained a particularly fond memory for these ringers.

Eighteen years later, most of that group, aided by two Trinity Ringer graduates of more recent years, returned to the Area II Festival, with Mrs. Stearns, now retired. These Trinity Alumni Ringers were thrilled to travel from Washington State, Texas, Florida, Maryland, Pennsylvania, and New Jersey to ring together, once again at Bucknell University under the direction of Dr. Payn.

## 2005 FESTIVAL AT BUCKNELL UNIVERSITY





## 2005 FESTIVAL CONCERT DEDICATED TO WILLARD H. MARKEY



The concert of the 45th Festival of Area II was dedicated to Willard Markey who gave years of service to the organization and the promotion of the Art of Handbell Ringing.

## WILLARD H. MARKEY (1910-2004)

How does one go about capsulizing 93 years of accomplishments in a few short paragraphs, especially when the person aforementioned lived every one of those years to the very fullest? Most of you know our Dad as the "mark" in Malmark Inc. That was a huge part of his life, but, in fact, he has always been an avid volunteer/main-mover in both the communities in which we live (Frederick, MD and Perkasie, PA) and the churches we attended. When East Rockhill Township celebrated its 100th anniversary by creating a 94-acre park, the community of Perkasie honored him by naming it *The Willard H. Markey Centennial Park*. Dad was very humbled by this and he delighted in keeping us informed of the Park activities and new driving range that followed. And what a thrill for us to be able to have picnics for his great grandchildren in that very park.

If you needed to know anything about handbells, Dad was your man. It was his passion. On April 1, 1974, he retired from Schulmerich after nearly 40 years of association. Then on May 1, 1974, at the age of 64 when most people are thinking about retirement, Willard Markey joined Jake Malta in creating Malmark Bellcraftsmen, thereby introducing Malmark bells to the music world. That was probably the longest vacation that Dad ever had. He served as vice president and secretary for the duration. He went to work every week up until 10 days before he died. In fact, not being able to get back to work is what caused his demise.

Dad was involved in many prominent organizations. He was a member of the Music Educators National Conference, its music industry conference, where he served as a director. In 1980 he was awarded Honorary Life Membership by the American Guild of English Handbell Ringers, Inc. Other associations included executive director of the Frederick Co., United Fund, director of the Lutheran Community in Telford, PA, organizer/chairman/member of the planning commission in Perkasie for decades. The list goes on and on ... and on.

Dad would be pleased if you would remember him for his enthusiasm, his can-do spirit, and his love for his work that fueled his longevity. He never planned to retire, in fact, I don't think he ever planned to die! He always said "I always wake up with goals for the day. The day that doesn't happen, it's over." He thoroughly enjoyed attending conferences and meeting all of you and sharing stories and renewing friendships—that was a big part of who he was.

Thank you for remembering Willard H. Markey and his love for handbells and music. He would be honored at your choice. He was very special to us, too.

Congratulations to all of the participants of the 2005 Festival Conference at Bucknell for a job well done. I certainly enjoyed myself and I hope you did as well. I'm glad that I got a chance to meet many of you as well as see some familiar faces. If I did not get a chance to talk to you, or you were unable to attend the Conference, I look forward to meeting you in the future.

I am happy to report that all eight sets of hand chimes have been loaned out for the upcoming school/church year. Last year, we were only able to loan five sets so this is a huge boost to the program. We have 2 sets each in New York and Pennsylvania and four sets in New Jersey. I am also happy to report that we were able to lend chimes to four schools as well as one community center along with three churches. This is a tremendous accomplishment in the use of handbells in education. The full list of hand chime recipients is below. ## **HOW CAN WE SAY THANKS?**

Six members of First Baptist Church, Lansdale, PA, left for three weeks in June for a planned mission trip to Almaty, Kazakhstan. Kent, our minister, was to teach a class on the Trinity at Central Asia Leadership Training Seminary. (CALTC) He asked if anyone was interested in going along to Kazakhstan. Several persons volunteered. Greg, a retired business owner, traveled around Kazakhstan teaching business seminars. Judy, our Christian Education Director; Richie, a 17 year old senior in high school; and Dottie and Keith Reed spent 3 hours teaching in a public school about our American culture to children who are learning English. In the evenings we all taught a VBS program at CALTC. We also had opportunities to lead teacher training programs on discipline and teaching methods as well as marriage and family life for church members.

Several months before we left for Kazakhstan, I received an e-mail from Gail Ritchey asking if we wanted to take a three octave set of hand chimes to Kazakhstan. The Nittany Valley Handbell Festival choirs would donate this set if we could use it in our work. We would also need to train a director and the ringers so that the hand chimes would continue to be used after we left. Of course, we said, "Yes, we will take them." Kazakhstan was contacted and advised that a musical director was needed to direct a musical instrument that they had never seen. Meanwhile, at home, a number of music stores were asked to make donations of music. Beginning level music arrived from Young's Music Store in Allentown, PA, Loser's Music Store, and Chorister's Guild.

I was able to have three different hand chime choirs playing different songs in the three areas where we worked. The teachers at the public school chose 15 students who rehearsed and then performed for the other 45 students in their summer program. At the VBS program, the 15 older children learned two sacred songs that they performed for their parents at the closing program. In both groups the children learned to count and to recognize their notes and the note values. I learned to count to four in Russian. On our second Sunday, I played a hand chime solo in church to introduce hand chimes to the congregation. Lastly, at Resurrection Church, we were able to start a hand chime choir consisting of mostly twenty year olds On the third and last Sunday, the Chime Choir got ready to play Amazing Grace when I was told that first they would play For The Beauty of the Earth. Luckily, we had practiced several songs including both of these. The words were projected on the wall both in English and Russian and the congregation sang while we played. The applause was tremendous! Representing the Nittany Valley Handbell Festival Choirs, I made a presentation of the chimes to the Resurrection Church and their new director, Inna Afanasyeva. How emotional this was to me to make this presentation! Inna is also a teacher at the school and hopes to be able to continue the chime program there.

So how can we say thank you to all those who made this experience possible? Our mission trip was a wonderful experience, but being able to introduce hand chimes to people who never heard of these instruments was like a dream. To see the joy on their faces when they heard the music was thrilling.

I wish that I could personally thank everyone who had a part in donating this set of hand chimes to the Kazak people of Central Asia. With their enthusiasm, I'm sure the program will continue with much success. *Bal'SHOye spa Siba*. THANK YOU VERY MUCH.

- Decision of the judges is final. Area II reserves the right to select entries that, in its sole judgment, are suitable for its festivals' purpose.
- 7. Winning entries will be performed at the 2007 Young Ringers' Festival and Festival Conference.
- 8. Area II will request a suitable dedication line when the composition is published. Area II reserves the right to be the sole dedicatee.
- Winning compositions may <u>not</u> be played in any festival, neither area nor local, prior to the 2007 Area II Young Ringers' Festival and Festival Conference.
