RINGING in ROMANIA

Last summer, as part of a mission trip with International Children's Aid Foundation (icafkids.org), a handbell choir from Area II went to Romania with 4 octaves of bells and 3 octaves of chimes in hand. In addition to giving several concerts of our own, your Area II representatives went into high gear teaching 25 children and adults to play and present a concert in 4 days. We had so many potential ringers come to the Christian Center in Brad that we ended up with two handchime choirs; a beginning group of non-readers, and a more advanced group. We were very pleased to have several of the children who started playing chimes in 1999 ringing with us in our advanced group.

The instruction was hands-on (ALL hands) as 12 of us worked with the different groups. You can't put that many directors in the same room without the working of the Holy Spirit in evidence. We had 3 mother and daughter teams helping (Traci & Brittany Love, Peggy & Katie McNamee, and Jenny & Sarah Mischner), 1 grandmother and granddaughter team (Judy & Alyssa Dinkler), plus Erica Hoffman, Dottie Reed, Marilyn Shenenberger and Margaret Zabo. We did rhythm games with one group while the other group rang. Since we had all just taken Janet Carter's ever popular Maori Stick Games, the Romanians learned them too. Peggy McNamee taught four girls from the state orphanage to Stretch and Switch; which they performed for a crowd of 100 or more along with the newly formed Christian Center Chime Choirs.

By the third day, it was clear we would need another set of chimes. Since school was not in session, we went to the elementary teacher in Criscior who had started a choir with the chimes we took over in 1999, and borrowed their set. With only a curtain between the two rooms, it was a bit chaotic, but we could now all practice playing our music at the same time.

The children were so excited about playing, and so proud of their accomplishment, that when they would play a piece correctly, they cheered and applauded for themselves. God outdid himself in the miracle department when he sent us a wonderful Romanian musician to be our translator. He is also a teacher, and by the end of the second day, was directing the beginning choir. He has agreed to continue as their director while working on his Masters degree and teaching at the local high school. When we left he was making up a schedule for them to practice several times a week, and was thinking ahead to when they would make their first CD. I want to share his last report with you.

"Hi Marilyn,

Thank you for your prayers about the Chimes programs in the Christmas Day. It was a real success. We played in 3 churches: the Baptist church on Christmas Day morning, the Pentecostal church in the afternoon, and a church in a village near Brad on Monday morning. All the churches were full of people. We played 5 songs (Joy to the Word, An English Christmas, O Little Town of Bethlehem, Away in a Manager and Caroling Medley). The members of the advanced group are between 9-25 years old, but they do a great job. The people from the churches were so impressed about their work and the ringers were very proud to be part of this group.

Now is a little more difficult period because they finish first semester and have a lot of exams and tests. I hope at the beginning of February to have all the group together; our project is to play 2 Sundays a month in church.

If it is possible to send bass chimes B3, A3, G3 (or whatever you think), let me know, because we have 2 or 3 more people who want to become part of the advanced group and they work for this. If you can't send some chimes please give me some ideas on this.

He reports that Cip is indeed rehearsing several times a week: Monday, Wednesday, and Friday from 6 pm to 8 pm. Dave watched part of a rehearsal with 15 ringers, which included four teens from the State orphanage in Brad, and four from the Christian orphanage in Criscior. One of the girls said the Christian Center where they ring is home.

Thanks to the Area II Board for making this a reality for these children, who would never have had such an opportunity if it weren't for the gift of these chimes, and the continued support of their program.


