



Aran 2 Ringer Parisues Drawn

In January, Erin Glendening, a former TTT editor and Area II webmaster, looked up and saw that her stars were in alignment...all pointed toward Raleigh, NC. Being unemployed in Pittsburgh for several months made the decision easier to audition for The Raleigh Ringers. None of Erin's friends had any question that her star was in ascent. They were right. Erin is one of four new ringers in this premier, internationally known community handbell ensemble, all of whom re-audition each year!

Erin's handbell journey to Raleigh began in Pella, Iowa where she grew up, learned to ring at church, and went to the college where her dad teaches. Like a lot of ringers, Erin began in the junior high church choir, but by the time she was in college, an adult choir was formed and Erin and her mother both joined. Erin moved to Pittsburgh after college but her mom still rings bells at Second Reformed Church in Pella.

In Pittsburgh, Erin found a church home at Shadyside Presbyterian where there was a handbell choir. Fate had it that Erin eventually became the director of this choir. Erin continued to expand her own skill set by learning solo and ensemble ringing. She also joined the Volkwein Ringers, a community group, so she'd have a chance to ring. When that group disbanded, Erin looked for another place to ring and joined the advanced choir at Mt Lebanon United Methodist Church. She understands the importance of ringing to a director.

Erin's desire to become a member of The Raleigh Ringers really began when the group made their first Pittsburgh

appearance. Erin couldn't wait to help. In addition to working on the committee, she helped to unload the truck and set up the stage for the concert. Being a techie, she got to sit in on their rehearsal and was impressed with director Dave Harris's way of working with the team, his high standards, and his music selections. Erin had the opportunity to experience his tutelage first hand as a participant in the Masterclass under Dave at the Area II festival in 2005 at Bucknell University.

"So Erin, what is life like with The Raleigh Ringers?" this writer asked. "Intense," she replied! The group is preparing thirteen pieces for their new concert season that begins April 14. Rehearsals begin at 7 pm and do not end before 10:30 pm. The seventeen ringers are all totally committed to the art form and do their best to help each other. "We have to think outside the box all the time," says Erin. "The difficulty of the music means that we have to look out for each other all the time. The other ringers have been really good about making suggestions to help me learn all this new music."

As a new member of the group, Erin received a ringer membership to AGEHR. She has always valued her membership in the Guild and is grateful for the experience that she had during her time on the Area II Board of Directors. The group will be performing at the AGEHR Seminar in Dallas in July and will be in Harrisburg November 30 and Pittsburgh December 1.

Calling All Beginning Handbell Directors!!

Area 2 AGEHR has a new learning experience for beginning handbell/handchime directors and those who are considering assuming this position. On Saturday, April 21, the Western PA Handbell Festival will be held at The Community United Methodist Church of Harrison City. This one-day festival is designed for handbell choirs that play level 1 and 2 music; selections that are on the "easy" side of the

difficulty scale. During the morning of April 21, we will offer a seminar for beginning directors while the festival choir is being rehearsed: 9:30 am until 12:30 pm.

Topics to be covered include:

Equipment: what do I need and how do I take care of it?

Ringers: what skills do new ringers need?

How many ringers do I need?

Music: How do I know what music I need?

How do I "prepare" the music I have selected?

Rehearsal: How do I prepare myself for the first rehearsal?

How do I teach my ringers the music?

How do I run an effective rehearsal?

Techniques: What exactly are handbell/handchime techniques?

How can I learn them? How do I teach them?

Conducting: What arm movements work for handbells?

How do I communicate with my ringers?

Education: Where can I learn more?

Are there books that can help me?

If you need help in answering any of the above questions, please consider registering for the Beginning Director's Seminar on April 21st. The cost is \$20. You may register by calling or writing to Susan Simmons, event registrar. Check should be made to Western PA Directors Group.

The seminar clinician will be Nancy Lutz. She is director of handbells at Mt Lebanon United Methodist Church in Pittsburgh where she has a graded children's program, a youth choir and three adult ensembles. Do You Know??

Are you aware of the many grants and scholarships Area II has to offer? The Betty B. Garee Scholarship is for first time attendees to Area Festivals and Seminars as well as National Seminars. The Charlie Cramer Scholarship is for non-ringing "roadies" who help to move all your bells and equipment.

Solo Ringer to Perform in PA Area

Nancy Hascall of Lake Oswego, Oregon has performed as a handbell soloist since 1989 and has taught solo and ensemble ringing at all levels, both privately and for regional, national, and international handbell events.

Performing throughout the U.S., Canada and Australia, she has become known for her graceful ringing style and sensitivity, as well as her dazzling technique. In her quest for greater musicality and access to a wider repertoire,

Nancy developed a system of techniques called traveling fourin-hand, which is now used by handbell soloists throughout the world.

In addition to performing, conducting, and teaching, Nancy has authored several articles on ringing techniques for Overtones magazine, and has more than twenty compositions and arrangements in print, including works for handbell solo, duet, quartet, and choir. In 2003 Nancy recorded her first CD, "Ringing From the Heart," available online at:

Nancy directs Portland-based community handbell choir Bells of the Cascades and the Sanctuary Bell Choir of Portland First United Methodist Church. With her husband Glen, she still rings in the handbell choir at Lake Grove Presbyterian Church where she was first introduced to bells over twentyfive years ago.
