Message from the Chair

Spring is a busy time for most of us. There are special days like Mother's Day and Father's Day, and special activities such as confirmations, graduations, and weddings to name a few. It is also the time of year when many handbell programs have their final concert prior to taking a "break" during the summer. In addition to these many individual concerts, our area is blessed to have many local festivals in the spring. Some have been in existence for 30 years or more. You can read about some of this year's festivals in this issue.

For me, spring also meant two important meetings - our Area II Board and the National Area Advisory Board meeting. Here are some of the important highlights of those meetings.

Area Meeting

- Final plans for the summer's Read & Ring were made. If you haven't registered yet, there may still be time. You don't want to miss out on this wonderful combination of ringing and relaxation. Contact Kathie Bittenbender for more information and space availability.
- Plans for our 2009 Festival Conference and Young Ringers' Festival are proceeding. David Harris will be our Festival Conductor, Fred Gramann will be conducting the Master Class and Kathleen Wissinger will be working with our Young Ringers. We are excited about our new Genesis Track for first time choirs. The conductor for that track will be announced in our fall issue.
- We read through and accepted six applications for our Handchime Lending Program for the next school year. (Read more about that elsewhere in this issue). The area has 9 sets of chimes to lend, so we still have 3 sets available. Applications are accepted as long as sets are available.
- We rang through 17 new handbell compositions that were entered in our composition contest for the 2009 Festivals. It was not an easy decision but two winners (one for Young Ringers and one for Festival Conference) were selected. Winners and titles will be announced on the website as soon as publication details are worked out.
- Winners of the CHiME drawing in New York and New Jersey were drawn. More about that is in the CHiME report.

Applications for Betty Garee scholarships for this summer's events were received. Look for reports from those recipients in the fall issue.

<u>National Area Advisory Meeting</u> – these meetings are held twice a year and include members of the National office and representatives (usually chairs) from all twelve areas. This last meeting also included members of the National Executive Board. Some highlights from that meeting:

- The new director of Membership & Administration, Katie Schlegel was introduced.
- JR Smith, publications director, announced that future issues of "Overtones" will have a pull-out section called "tips 'n' tools" which will contain tips for new directors, rehearsal planning ideas, resources for music educators, processionals to copy and many other helpful ideas
- A Music Educators Training Seminar will be held in Sept. All attendees will be provided with resources for music educators that will be brought back to the area. (Area II will be sending two people to this seminar) Look for more information in future issues of TTT.

• An extensive public relations campaign will be conducted in conjunction with this summer's International Symposium. Plans are for interesting human interest features from all across the country to appear on local and national television.

Lengthy discussions on how to reverse the downward trend of membership and attendance at events were held. (Members of choirs are considered members under their director's membership number.) This will be an important focus of National in the upcoming months.

The Marvelous Musical Martins, Doug & Martha, from Hopewell Junction, NY will be the featured quest performers for the National Seminar and International Festival in Orlando this summer. Their program, $m{A}$ Celebration Of Bells, Their History, Mystery and Musical Magic features this special singing/instrumental (handbells, violin, concertina & piano) duo, through unique vignettes, presenting the contribution of various countries and cultures to the world of bells. Besides performing in Beacon, NY with Pete Seeger at the monthly Sloop Clearwater meeting and the Howland Cultural Center this May they will also present a Mother's Day **"Ring In The Spring"** show at a Independent Living Village in, NJ. Their Arts-N-Ed, "Let Freedom Ring" program uses the sight, sound and symbol of the bell to share with students the idea that they soon will become the citizens leaders of our country and the world in the next generation. The Martins will be presenting these programs on Long Island and in Maine and New Hampshire this May & June. These programs feature a workshop in which they train 20 student to ring handbells and hand chimes during the presentation. The student's brief performance underscores the fact that "freedom is not a spectator sport" but something we all need to be involved in. The students also join in the closing vignette with flags from countries around the world as Doug & Martha conclude their programs with their original composition, **One World**, showing how we more than ever need to work together to bring about world peace. 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



HUDSON VALLEY HANDBELL FESTIVAL – APRIL 26, 2008

The 33rd annual Hudson Valley Handbell Festival Conference was held this year on Saturday, April 26th at Nyack College in Nyack, New York. One hundred and ninety- eight ringers from twenty-two choirs attended the all day event under the direction of guest conductor Kathy Ebling-Thorne from Westminister Choir College. Ringers attended the event from as far away as Edison, NJ; Sparta, NJ; Kingston, NY; and Sayville (Long Island), NY. Local conductor, Eileen Laurence, directed her composition "Lament and Dance." An evening performance was presented, with an offering collected to benefit the Area II Endowment Fund. In previous years, offerings collected have provided replacement bell sets to churches affected by Hurricane Katrina. The chair of this year's even was Dot Abelman from Harrington Park, NJ. Co-chair Abi Gray will head up the event next year with guest director Tim Waugh.

Also honored at the evening performance was RoseMarie Wildman who will retire from the Riverside Church, New York, NY this year. RoseMarie has been involved with HVHFC since its beginning in 1976 as a director of participating choirs, as chair of the event and as a music director of the event. She spent much of her career as children's choir director and handbell choir director at Emanuel Evangelical Lutheran Church in

Pleasantville where she established 4 handbell choirs. She also served at a church in Chappaqua and at Riverside Church. She has been active in AGEHR both in Area II and on the National level.

Hosting an Event

Area II is a rather large geographical area and in trying to bring our workshops to your local area, we are always looking for sites for these events. Have you thought about offering to host but were afraid it would be too much work? If you were asked to host one of our workshops would the thought send you running the other way? Would your response be "I'm too busy" or "I don't think my church would let me do that"? It's really not that scary and if you involve members of your choir, it is a lot easier than you might think.

So, what is involved? First, we are here to help. Our workshop chair, Jackie Anderson, will lead you through the process step by step.

What kind of facility is needed? It depends on the format of the event, but in general, we need one or two large rooms that can hold a couple choirs and one or two smaller rooms that can be used for classes. (For a spring reading session workshop, only one large room is needed.)

What's expected of the host? Once the number of rooms has been determined, the date and time set, the host needs to "spread the word" to churches in the area. Labels of all members in your immediate area are available and emails can be used to advertise among members. Hosts are also encouraged to send information about the workshop to churches in the area that have bells but may not be members of AGEHR.

In addition to the labels, Area II will send you a list of participants and those who are willing to bring bells and pads (if needed). The Area will supply the clinician(s) and all necessary materials.

The host provides a registration table/area and snacks during registrations and beverages for lunch (will be reimbursed). Some choirs/church groups choose to provide lunch (for a fee) as a small fundraiser for their group. That's about all there is to it.

We are currently planning our workshops for the fall. Won't you think about hosting one in your local area? Do you still have questions? Contact Jackie Anderson, Workshop Chair.



Area II Announces Unpublished Manuscripts Reading Session for Read & Ring Seminar

A new class for Area II summer's Read and Ring will be a session of reading through unpublished manuscripts submitted by composers, arrangers and hopefully from some new composers.

Many composers have pieces they have not heard rung by choirs - for many reasons- or just have a piece they'd like to share with others. Many ringers have never played from manuscript if they don't have a composer in their midst - and have never played a piece that was not already published. Composers will find out what works (and not) in their pieces, and ringers will see fresh new music - some which doesn't fit the mold of what is generally available from publishers.

Area II invites all composers - whether published or not - to submit an unpublished piece for ringers to play. You might have a piece that you haven't heard yet on bells, or maybe your score is too challenging for your own ringers or too big for the bell set on hand, or you don't have time to rehearse it. whatever the reason - submit your piece for all to ring! Hand written or computer engraved - it matters not. You may submit more that one piece.

Please consider the following when submitting manuscripts:

- 1. Level 3 and below are best for sight reading.
- 2. Don't expect too much from a Level 4+ or 5 piece.
- 3. Time may be limited per piece, depending on the number of score entries.
- 4. Any sized ensemble is acceptable 2 oct., 2-3 oct., 3-5 oct., etc.
- 5. Provide a bells used chart for each submission.
- 6. Chimes may be available but cannot be guaranteed.
- 7. Submit enough score copies for a full choirs plus a director (i.e. for a 3-5 oct. piece, 15 scores; for a 2 octave piece 11 copies)
- 8. Print on 8 1/2 x 11 sheets in regular score format.
- 9. Hole punch all scores for ease of page turns. Ideally, all pages are printed front to back.
- 10. Scores will be destroyed or returned to you after the session if you provide self addressed stamped envelope.

Each piece should be original, public domain, arrangement, or written with "express permission from copyright holder to arrange" (please send the permission statement.)

Between the time of submission and the actual event (July 12-15), pieces may not be currently submitted to any contest or to any publisher for consideration.

If you are present at the Read & Ring, you may direct your own piece - or a capable director will be glad to direct it for you.

Please include the following in your submission letter:

Name, description of each composition - title, range, level, (opt. chimes?), performance time, comments desired, any special notes. If you desire constructive comments on your piece, so indicate.


Deadline for receiving scores is June 30.

There is no provision for making copies at the event. All entries must be received prior to Area II Read & Ring.


