Attending a summer festival, as part of a choir or as an individual, builds many memories. When this special group heard, that as an Area II chair, I would be conducting one piece at the festival, they made plans to once again go to festival. What a special memory for me to look out and see 8 of those ringers (with children in tow)! Among many festival memories, this one is the best!

Many thanks to Courtney Williams Volski, Katherine Lavery, Judith Lavery Rozic, Elizabeth Lavery Hartman, Jim Braden, Jeff Braden, Mary Macdonald Shaffer and Janette Macdonald Merrill for honoring me in this way...and for your help with the chapel service!!

I hope that if you have attended a summer festival, you, too, are storing special memories, and if you haven't been yet, put 2011 on your calendar; you won't regret it!



Beginning Techniques: This year's fall workshops will be a little different. Again we will have a section for those people who want to work on techniques at the beginning level. Topics covered will include the proper techniques for straight ringing, stopped techniques (such as malleting, marting and plucking) echoes, swinging, and an introduction to the singing bell technique. The group will prepare one or two pieces of level 1+ music using the various techniques.

Intermediate Techniques and Ensemble Ringing: The second section will focus on an intermediate level of all the above mentioned techniques. Also the ringers will work on ensemble style ringing, applying the different techniques in an ensemble setting. This intermediate group will prepare two pieces of music, one an intermediate level piece of music and the other an ensemble piece.





Betty Garree Scholarship Winner, Kendra Parker Shares her Conference Memories

It was a beautiful sunny day as I set off for Scranton, PA. I was a little nervous and a little excited, not knowing what to expect from my first Festival Conference. I arrived on schedule, got settled in the room and promptly attended a hands-on class and a massed rehearsal (with approximately 250 other ringers). It was then that I realized I was in for something very special! We ended the first evening with a concert by the Raleigh Ringers, which was a truly amazing experience that took me to both ends of the spectrum - in awe of the musicianship displayed and laughing out loud at the clever antics they performed.

There is nothing like a Festival Conference to set your imagination in high gear. The classroom

experiences were first rate, taught by (not necessarily recommended, but some of the best in the business. The still shows commitment) rehearsals. led by David Harris. music director and conductor extraordinaire of the Raleigh Ringers, were like mini-lessons in rehearsal techniques where we learned the importance of communication through the light hearted, gentle corrections of our director. I left Scranton with new ideas, fresh resolve, a renewed excitement for the handbells and a host of memories for which I am truly thankful. The following are some words that describe what I saw at the festival:

Excellence – having fun is not an excuse for not playing to the best of vour ability

Good habits - the bad habits show up fast when you play this much

Friendship – Juanita and Mary Rita were soooo much fun

Commitment – demonstrated by the mother who attended rehearsals with her baby strapped on her back

Adventure – to the couple who celebrated their 53rd wedding anniversary on day 3

Determination – by the person who kept up with every body even with only one leg

Teamwork - there is no "I" in "team" and with hundreds of people playing together we had to work together for the common good

Success - a fun concert at the end of the weekend that was enjoyed by all in attendance

I would like to thank the Betty G. Garee Scholarship Committee for this amazing opportunity and encourage anyone who has not attended this conference to apply for the scholarship in 2011. You will not be disappointed!



The Hills of Honduras are Alive with the Sound of Music

High in the mountains of Honduras a small red metal handbell rings. This past summer I was on a Heifer International Study Tour which took us to villages where Heifer was working. One afternoon was spent at Hogar Diamante, a home for boys ages 7-14, who had been living on the streets. Extreme poverty pushes the boys into the streets to look for food, to obtain work, and beg for their families. This was the first time the bells came out of my plastic bag. I rang one and many


boys left the soccer field to see what made that sound. We were able to play no qas, but people were vibrant and a scale, chords, and a simple tune. There I had the advantage of someone who could speak Spanish. This would be my first bell group in Honduras!

Later in the tour we went to a village high in the mountains and saw women preparing vegetables to be sent to market. Again, a bell sounded and the community came to see what made the sound. It was important that some adults knew what to do with the bells, if they ever had bells. My greatest joy came with the children, the youngest being four years old. They were terrific. They watched, they "cut off" together, and even through the rain we rang our bells. I hadn't even realized I was getting very wet. I spoke no Spanish and they no English. Yes, music is an international language and with facial expressions, hand and arms, it all works together. We rang simple tunes and the first line of "Joy to the World"

Villages had no water, no electricity, accepting. The children have to walk two miles to school each day. In spite of all this there was joy, and an eagerness to ring the bells. When we left the four year old came to me with his mother to shake my hand. I found a home for the bells, and yes, this was the highlight of my Honduras trip.
