In Loving Memory - God needed 2 more tuba players

JONATHAN RAYMOND HINKSON

A board member of Area II, Jon served as NJ Chime Representative. Many of you might remember Jon for teaching the boomwhacker classes at our festivals and other Area II events. He played in the brass group for our festival in Scranton last year.

Jon was born on June 23, 1982 to Wayne and Bernice Hinkson. He died Thursday March 18, 2010 as a result of a motor vehicle accident. He is survived by his wife of 3 years, Amy, his 2 year old daughter, Makayla, his parents, and brothers, Michael and Nathaniel.

Jon attended the Pemberton Township, NJ schools from Kindergarten through High School. In 5th grade he began his music lessons on the trumpet. In middle school he jumped at the chance to try out the euphonium. He loved the bass notes. In the summer before his freshman year he was encouraged by his band director to play the tuba. He never looked back.

Jon received his BS degree in Music Education from The College of New Jersey. He wasn't far from home which allowed him to participate in his church's music program - including handbells.

His first two years of teaching were at the Mott School in Trenton, NJ. He borrowed chimes from the AGEHR Area II Lending program for them to play. The students were always excited to see what they could do next.

The next move was to Mary E. Volz Elementary and Middle Schools where he taught general music to the middle school and conducted the band in the elementary and middle school. He purchased a set of handchimes and had two choirs, one in the elementary and one in the middle school. They practiced two mornings a week before school started.

For the past several summers, Jon taught at the Csehy Summer School of Music teaching brass and directing the ministry program.


Jon was the director of the Praise Ringers (Teen), Boomwhacker/chime program (1st & 2nd grade) and helped his wife with the preschool Rhythm bells at the Easton Bible Church in Hainesport, NJ.

Nevertheless, he had been to numerous local, Area and National events, stuffing envelopes, sharpening pencils, creating name tags, moving equipment, other odd jobs, and his favorite, picking up board members and clinicians from the local airport. Just these past few years, he was back helping Area II again when Jeremy came calling for a clinician, equipment loaner and band member (with Jon Hinkson at Scranton).

His family would like to thank their friends from Area II, and the rest of the handbell world, for all of their kind words, gestures and donations.

This summer join us for a Vibration Vacation – a 2-day ringing event – coming to a location near you!

Previously known as the Read & Ring Seminar, your Area II Board is planning a summer event that includes the best of the Read & Ring with a few changes that we hope you will enjoy. First, in an effort to bring the event closer to you, we are holding the event in two locations, one in New Jersey and one in Pennsylvania. In addition, one overnight has been eliminated in an effort to keep the cost more affordable. This two-day event is designed for the ringer, director, entire choir or several members of a choir. Geared toward teens and adults, attendees will be able to improve their ringing and/or directing skills as they ring in a massed "track" of four sessions and through a variety of class options.

Continuing Education Credits are offered to certified teachers in all three of the area's states. Vendors, including Jeffers Handbell Services and Raleigh Ringer merchandise, will be available.

Tuesday & Wednesday, August 10 & 11 will be held at the Liberty Corner Presbyterian Church, 45 Church Street, Liberty Corner, NJ (near Basking Ridge, NJ). Housing at a special rate (mention Group:AGEHR-Rate:AGEH) has been arranged at the Days Inn Conference Center, 1260 US Rte 22 East, Bridgewater, NJ 08807, 908-526-9500.

Thursday & Friday, August 12 & 13 will be held at the First United Methodist Church, 801 Allegheny Street, Hollidaysburg, PA (near Altoona, PA). Housing at a special rate has been arranged at the Courtyard Marriott, 2 Convention Center Drive, Altoona, Pennsylvania 16602, 814-312-1800.

- Yes, the churches are air conditioned!
- Day one at both sites will begin with registration at noon with the first classes/tracks beginning at 1:00. The event will conclude at 4:00 on Day 2.
- Both events will include dinner and ice cream "social" on Day 1 and snacks & lunch on Day 2. Breakfast is on your own and available at the hotel.

Clinicians / Faculty:

Both the Tins (level 2/3) and Coppers (level 3/4) tracks will be conducted by Area II's own Mike Joy. Music will not have to be prepared in advance, but ringers will read and work through the music together from the beginning.

Ringers will receive the music packet for their chosen track at registration. Ringers are responsible for the cost of the packet and will be informed of the cost prior to the event. Donna Kinsey (VV/PA Seminar) and Marilyn Shenenberger (VV/NJ Seminar) will be offering classes that relate to the music for each of the tracks.

In addition, **Nancy Lutz** is back to teach the Beginner Directors' Track. In a response to your requests, she will also be teaching an Intermediate Directors' Track for directors who are ready for the next level.

Seminar Structure:

All tracks consist of 5 hours of ringing or instruction in all aspects of directing a handbell choir over 4 sessions.

There is evidence of handbell foundries dating back to the late 1600's, with at least 12 or so in operation between 1850 and 1920. William Butler's book, Musical Handbells, lists even more. Some were in business for a quick minute, while others endure to this day."


